## Day 1: Galatians 1

### Questions:

What is the primary message that Paul emphasizes in this chapter?

Reflect on Paul's authority as an apostle and the source of his message.

How does Paul address the issue of false teaching and the distortion of the gospel?

Are there any personal applications you can draw from Paul's defense of his ministry?

## Day 2: Galatians 2

### Questions:

Personal Reflection Question: How can you cultivate the fruit of the Spirit in your life, allowing love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control to flourish?



## Day 6: Galatians 6

### Questions:

What instructions does Paul give regarding restoring a brother who has been caught in a sin?

Reflect on the principle of sowing and reaping as it relates to spiritual matters.

How does Paul emphasize the importance of doing good to all, especially to fellow believers?

Are there areas in your life where you can be more intentional about bearing one another's burdens?

Personal Reflection Question: How can you actively engage in acts of kindness and service towards others, particularly within the family of believers?

Questions:

## Day 4: Philippians 4

### Questions:

Consider Paul's instructions regarding thinking on things that are true, noble, just, pure, lovely, and of good report.

Are there areas in your life where you need to surrender your worries to God and focus on His peace?

Personal Reflection Question: How can you cultivate a lifestyle of rejoicing, prayer, and gratitude, as encouraged by Paul in Philippians 4?



## Day 1: Colossians 1

### Questions:

What does Paul express gratitude for in this chapter, and why?

Reflect on Paul's emphasis on the preeminence of Christ.

How does Paul describe the role of Christ in creation and redemption?

Are there any specific encouragements or challenges in this chapter that resonate with you personally?

Personal Reflection Question: How can you center your life on the preeminence of Christ, following Paul's example in Colossians 1?



## Day 2: Colossians 2

### Questions:

Reflect on Paul's warning against being taken captive by philosophy and empty deceit.

How does Paul emphasize the sufficiency of Christ for salvation and spiritual growth?

### Day 3: Colossians 3

## Day 4: Colossians 4
