Day 1: Hebrews 1

Questions:

How does the author of Hebrews emphasize the superiority of Jesus over the angels?

Reflect on the descriptions of Jesus as the “exact representation and perfect imprint of His [Father’s] essence.” How does this deepen your understanding of who Jesus is?

How does the author use Old Testament scriptures to demonstrate the divinity and supremacy of Christ?

What implications does Jesus’ superiority have for your faith and understanding of salvation?

Personal Reflection Question: How does recognizing Jesus’ divine authority and His role in creation affect your daily worship and relationship with Him?

Day 2: Hebrews 2

Questions:

Why is it crucial to pay closer attention to the truths we have heard, according to this chapter?

How does Jesus' humanity enable Him to be a merciful and faithful High Priest?

What does it mean that Jesus shared in our humanity to render the devil powerless over death?

How can the knowledge of Jesus' shared humanity and His victory over death impact your approach to life's challenges?

Personal Reflection Question: In what ways does Jesus' empathy and shared humanity bring you comfort and strength in your own struggles?

Day 3: Hebrews 3

Questions:

How is Jesus compared to Moses in this chapter, and what makes Jesus superior?

Reflect on the warning against unbelief and hardening of the heart. Why is this warning significant for believers today?

How does the author encourage believers to exhort one another daily?

What steps can you take to ensure your heart remains responsive to God's voice?

Personal Reflection Question: How can you actively encourage and support fellow believers in maintaining a steadfast faith?

Day 4: Hebrews 4

Questions:

What role does hope play as an anchor for the soul, and how can you cultivate this hope in your life?

Day 7: Hebrews 7

Questions:

How is Melchizedek described, and how does Jesus' priesthood resemble and surpass his?

Reflect on the permanence and superiority of Jesus' priesthood. What comfort does this bring you?

What does it mean that Jesus is able to save completely those who come to God through Him?

How can you rely on Jesus' unchanging priesthood to strengthen your faith and intercede for others?

Personal Reflection Question: In what ways can you deepen your reliance on Jesus as your eternal High Priest in your daily life?

Day 8: Hebrews 8

Questions:

What are the main points the author makes about Jesus as the High Priest of a new covenant?

Reflect on the differences between the old covenant and the new covenant. How does this enhance your understanding of God's promises?

How does the author describe the new covenant's effect on the hearts and minds of believers?

How can you live in the reality of the new covenant, with God's laws written on your heart?

Personal Reflection Question: How does the new covenant change your relationship with God and influence your daily life?

Day 9: Hebrews 9

Questions:

What does the author describe about the earthly tabernacle and its limitations?

Reflect on the significance of Jesus entering the heavenly tabernacle with His own blood. How does this provide a better sacrifice?

How does Jesus' sacrifice cleanse our consciences from acts that lead to death?

How can you live in the freedom and assurance provided by Jesus' once-for-all sacrifice?

Personal Reflection Question: How does Jesus' perfect sacrifice influence your sense of forgiveness and your commitment to living a holy life?

Day 10: Hebrews 10

Questions:

Questions:

Questions:

Reflect on the call to show hospitality, remember those in prison, and honor marriage. How can you apply these principles in your life?

How does the author emphasize the unchanging nature of Jesus Christ and its significance for believers?

What does it mean to continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God?

Personal Reflection Question: How can you implement the practical instructions from Hebrews 13 in your daily interactions and lifestyle?

Questions:
