

## Even More Ideas to Enrich the Middle Grades

This section is designed to give you **multiple choices** under each enrichment subject so you can keep things fresh, follow interests, and weave real life into learning. Feel free to rotate, simplify, or expand any of these as your homeschool grows.

### **GEOGRAPHY – Choose What Fits Each Term**

#### **U.S. Geography Ideas:**

- State Scrapbook: Print a blank state map and add facts, flags, animals, and recipes.
- Postcard Exchange: Join a Facebook homeschool group and swap postcards from every state.
- Landmark Research: Pick one landmark each week (Statue of Liberty, Golden Gate Bridge) and learn the story behind it.
- License Plate Game: Keep a running list of states you see on the road.
- U.S. Trivia Night: Make a game out of capitals, nicknames, and borders.

#### **World Geography Ideas:**

- Continent Study with Passport: Stamp a paper “passport” as you “visit” each country.
- World Food Day: Try cooking dishes from Mexico, Japan, France, India, or Kenya.
- Flat Travelers: Send a laminated “flat self” to friends or missionaries around the world.
- Cultural Celebration Week: Learn dances, traditions, holidays from another country.
- Online Pen Pal (safe & monitored): Exchange messages with another homeschooler abroad.

#### **US CIVICS & GOVERNMENT – Weekly or Monthly Options**

- Create a Constitution Lapbook or scroll with key freedoms written out.
- Watch Schoolhouse Rock videos and sing the songs.
- Visit a courthouse, library, or polling place on election day.
- Start a simple newsletter about local or family "news."
- Research a U.S. President each month and create a timeline or fact sheet.
- Hold a family debate: Should we get a dog? Should we move to the mountains?

## LIFE SKILLS & HOME ECONOMICS – Build Over the Years

### **Cooking:**

- Teach “kitchen safety basics” and knife handling.
- Assign a “Chef of the Week” role to plan, prep, and serve dinner (with help).
- Have a bake-off: who can make the best muffins?

### **Cleaning & Chores:**

- Create “morning checklists” laminated for each child.
- Teach how to sort and fold laundry with a race timer.
- Host a 20-minute power clean with a fun music playlist.

### **Finance:**

- Create a pretend store at home with prices and fake money.
- Let your child create a budget for a birthday party or sibling gift.
- Compare prices at the store: which brand is the best deal per ounce?

### **Other Life Skills:**

- Plan a pretend road trip (map route, budget gas & food).
- Teach how to write a thank-you note.
- Learn basic sewing: buttons, hemming, hand-stitching

## CHARACTER & EMOTIONS – Pick a Theme Each Month

- Kindness Tree: Add a paper leaf every time someone shows kindness.
- Scripture Memory Box: Keep memory verses on index cards and review daily.
- Read *Aesop’s Fables* and discuss morals.
- Roleplay “What would you do if...” scenarios at lunch.
- Use a feelings wheel or journal to talk about emotional vocabulary.
- Choose a Bible hero each week and study their character (Joseph = perseverance, Ruth = loyalty, David = courage)

## FINE ARTS – No Stress, Just Enjoy

### Art:

- Use YouTube tutorials for drawing, painting, or doodling.
- Create an art show with work from the whole year.
- Study one famous painting per week using picture study cards.

### Music:

- Composer study with storybooks like *Lives of the Musicians*.
- Make homemade instruments and create rhythms.
- Explore different genres: jazz, folk, opera, worship, and discuss.

### Creative Projects:

- Create a comic book using your own characters.
- Make homemade cards and wrapping paper.
- Try weaving, felting, or pottery if available.

## FOREIGN LANGUAGE – Gentle & Fun

- Learn Bible verses in Spanish or Latin.
- Watch familiar cartoons in another language with subtitles.
- Learn to sign a worship song in ASL.
- Use flashcards to label food or furniture.
- Play Bingo with new vocabulary words.
- Keep a notebook where you write one word a day with a picture.

## TECHNOLOGY – Hands-On and Purposeful

- Create a family newsletter in Google Docs or Canva.
- Use TypingClub or similar free sites for typing practice.
- Create a simple stop-motion film using LEGOs or toys.
- Teach how to make a slideshow with transitions and music.
- Learn to code using Scratch or Hour of Code (free sites).

- Discuss password safety and how to avoid scams or spam.

### **NATURE STUDY – Take It Outside**

- Choose a “Nature Focus of the Month” like birds, trees, weather, stars.
- Sketch plants and animals in a nature notebook.
- Create a homemade weather station (thermometer, rain gauge).
- Keep a moon observation calendar.
- Visit a different local park every Friday.
- Build a bug hotel or bee watering station.

### **ENTREPRENEURSHIP – Small Ideas That Build Confidence**

- Host a mini farmer’s market with homemade or homegrown items.
- Create and sell bookmarks, baked goods, soap, or t-shirts.
- Learn how to pitch an idea (“Shark Tank” style) to parents.
- Study famous entrepreneurs or Christian business leaders.
- Talk about value vs. cost—why we pay more for quality or service.
- Offer family services: cleaning, organizing, babysitting (with supervision).
