

 **Real-Life Writing Ideas (Grades 3–7)****1. Thank-You Notes**

Write a thank-you letter to someone who helped you, gave you a gift, or encouraged you.

2. Prayer Journal Entry

Write out a prayer or letter to God about something you're thankful for, worried about, or asking for.

3. To-Do Lists or Chore Charts

Make a list of tasks for the day or week. Younger kids can draw symbols; older ones can create organized checklists.

4. Devotional Reflection

After reading a Bible passage, write what it means to you and how you can apply it in your life.

5. Recipe or How-To Instructions

Write out a favorite recipe or give step-by-step instructions on how to make or do something (like folding laundry, building with LEGOs, or making slime).

6. Birthday Card Messages

Create kind and encouraging birthday messages for friends, family, or neighbors.

7. Shopping Lists

Help plan a grocery trip or special meal by writing a shopping list.

8. Letters to Missionaries or Church Leaders

Send an encouraging note, prayer, or Bible verse to someone doing ministry work.

9. Journal of a Family Outing or Trip

Write a “trip report” about a visit to a park, museum, or family vacation. Include what you saw, learned, and enjoyed.

10. Family Newsletter

Create a one-page newsletter with updates, funny stories, or news to share with grandparents or friends.

11. Daily Weather or Nature Log

Keep track of the weather and changes in nature. Add drawings, temperature, or fun observations.

12. Script for a Skit or Video

Write and perform a short skit, puppet show, or pretend commercial with siblings.

13. Encouragement Notes

Write a note to put in someone's lunch box, Bible, or mirror to remind them they are loved.

14. Homeschool Schedule or Planner Page

Create a daily or weekly homeschool planner. Include subjects, goals, and time estimates.

15. List of Personal Goals

Write a list of things you want to learn, improve, or accomplish this month or year.

16. Prayer Requests List

Keep track of people you're praying for and updates on answered prayers.

17. Menu Plan

Plan out breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks for a day or week.

18. Invitation Letter or Event Flyer
